
Dear Ms. Koehn:

We will use this wonderful gift to ensure that high school students in GISD who are experiencing housing insecurity will continue to have access to important services they need.

The Georgetown Project could not make this journey without the support of caring people like you who believe in our vision and share our commitment to this vulnerable population of young people. We learned so much in the first year of serving high school students living in transition, the most important is the data linking regular visits to The NEST with improvements in academics, health and hygiene, and social skills. Every one of the 45 students served in The NEST since November passed core subjects and advanced a grade. Two seniors overcame staggering challenges and persevered to walk across the stage and receive their high school diploma. Both of these young people said they would have given up and dropped out if they had not found The NEST.

One of the seniors named Leah left a note for us on her last day at The NEST talking about how she never thought she would still be alive at this point in her life, much less be a high school graduate. The final sentence in her letter was, "Thank God for everyone who started The NEST." I want to echo Leah's words and express our heartfelt appreciation for your support of The Georgetown Project. We will be sure that these funds will be made available for GISD Homeless Education.
